## CE LATIN PRESCRIBED VOCAB LIST, LEVELS

1 – 167 words + unus-decem, primus-decimus

2 – 128 words + undecim-viginti (325)

This is a prescribed list – this means that

- if you know the words applicable to your level you will score 80%;
- if you know the endings to go with them, you will score 90%;
- if you have common sense and oomf, you will score 100%.

The words divide up as follows and the following key is used throughout (you will need to use your grammar book in conjunction with this vocab book):

### **Nouns** (*nom. & gen. given throughout*)

- 1 = goes like puell-a
- 2 = goes like serv-us
- 2, neut. = goes like bell-um
- 3, m. or f. = goes like rex
- 3, n. = goes like corpus

### **Adjectives**

Type 2-1-2

- adj.-us goes like serv-us
- adj.-a goes like puell-a
- adj.-um goes like bell-um

Type 3 (*m. & n., nom. & gen. given throughout*)

- adj.m./f. goes like rex
- adj.n. goes like corpus

### **Verbs** (*pres., inf. & perf. given throughout*)

- 1 goes like am-o
- 2 goes like mon-e-o
- 3 goes like reg-o
- 4 goes like aud-i-o

BUT note that all four types have the same endings (o/m, s, t, mus, tis, nt) and you only need to know the following five tenses for Level 1-2 – present, future, imperfect, perfect and pluperfect

### **OTHER**

Includes

- prepositions, e.g., prope + acc.
- adverbs, e.g., saepe
- question words, e.g., -ne
- numbers, e.g., unus, duo, tres, quattuor, quinque, sex, septem, octo, novem, decem
- other stuff.
